

<sup>\*</sup>Manasseh was a King of Judah, son of Hezekiah. He was crowned at the age of 12 and reigned for 55 years. Considered evil before God, he later changed his ways and became pious. See: 2 Chronicles 33

For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.


